

POLICE OFFICER POSITIONS:

The Parsons Police Department (PPD) is a full-service law enforcement agency and works with other local, state and federal agencies to ensure the safety and security of our city. Recruiting for Experienced and Recruit Police Officers is ongoing. We're not recruiting for the average. We are recruiting mature individuals who are self-motivated. Looking for service-oriented and mission driven individuals to place helping on par with enforcement.

Specialized training in active shooter response, crime prevention, Emergency Vehicle Operations courses, and Narcotics Investigation training.

Experienced or Lateral Officers must have more than one year of patrol experience after graduation from the basic academy. Experienced officers are given credit for prior policing experience and start higher on the agency's pay scale.

- Pay ranges from \$35,656 to \$45,802 with overtime opportunities
- Additional incentives available to a max of up to \$6,000 annually
- Police academy training fully paid
- Free tuition paid at Labette Community College to obtain an associates degree
- Full health care & dental coverage, paid holidays and paid vacation time

DISPATCHER POSITION:

Parsons PD Dispatch handles 25,000 incoming calls annually. Nearly 18,000 dispatched calls are

routed to officers.

Dispatchers are the '1st Responders, 1st Responders' connecting citizens with emergency services.

The Dispatch Center is currently being completely remodeled and upgraded with new technology.

- Pay ranges from over \$28,388 (in training) to over \$36,000 annually, plus overtime.
- Training is fully paid. \$1,200 annual incentive once certified by the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO).
- Free tuition paid at Labette Community College to obtain an Associates Degree.
- Full health care and Dental coverage. paid holidays and paid vacation time.
- Dispatchers work 12 hour shifts (only 15 work days a month).
